Database = Good starting points for psychology and MFT research

**You may need to use different databases depending on the subject and topic of research **

Academic Search Premier – provides full text for more than 4,500 journals, including more than 3,700 peer-reviewed titles. It covers the social sciences, humanities, general science (including psychology), multicultural studies, education, and much more. Uses the Ebsco Host interface.

Alt HealthWatch –Alt Healthwatch is an alternative health research database focused on complementary, holistic and integrated approaches to health care and wellness. It offers the latest information about the evolving practice of holistic medicine and therapies, and includes over 190 FT journals.

Digitalia Hispanica – includes eBooks and eJournals in Spanish with access to some of the most renowned publishers in Spain and Latin America. While the database is multidisciplinary, you will find scholarly resources in Religion, Philosophy, Psychology, History, Anthropology, and more.

Dissertations & Theses Global – ProQuest Dissertations and Theses Global provides access to more than 1.2 million full-text theses and dissertations available for download in PDF format, together with 2.7 million searchable citations to theses from around the world from 1861 to the present. Most of these theses were written to fulfill doctoral degrees. Includes digitized Fuller dissertations.

EBSCO eBook Academic Collection at Fuller Library – eBook Academic Collection (Ebsco) is a growing collection of full-text electronic books found in Ebsco Host. These “e-books” can either be browsed online or “checked out” for your exclusive use. The collection contains over 13,000 eBooks in psychological or MFT subject areas.

Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition – provides nearly 600 scholarly full-text journals covering a diverse range of medical and nursing sciences. This includes information on mental health and related pharmacology. Also features abstracts and indexing for over 830 additional health journals. Provided by Ebsco Host.

JSTOR – JSTOR Archival Collections includes full text articles from more than 1,500 leading academic journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. JSTOR Archival Collections can be accessed via JSTOR’s one search integrated platform, along with the JSTOR eBooks.

Medline – covers clinical medicine, psychiatry, nursing, and other medical fields, including citations from over 4,800 current biomedical journals, and over 19,000 older journals. The indexing covers from 1965 to the present, and includes some limited Full Text.

ProQuest eBook Central – ProQuest eBook Central is a multi-disciplinary, web-based eBook library lending-platform. These e-books can be browsed online or “checked out” for your exclusive use. All titles are discoverable through library’s online catalog.

ProQuest Research Library – a multidisciplinary resource featuring a diversified mix of scholarly journals, trade publications, and magazines across the top 150 subject areas (including psychology and related fields). Provides access to over 6,000 titles, 75% of which are available in full text.

PsycARTICLES (EBSCO) – contains more than 25,000 full-text articles from 42 journals published by American Psychological Association and allied organizations. Coverage includes general psychology and specialized basic, applied, clinical, and theoretical research in psychology.

PsycBOOKS (EBSCO) – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* APA PsycBooks. Includes over 10,000 chapters from over 600 books published by APA copyright 1953 – 2004, 100 out-of-print books, 70+ classic books, and the APA/Oxford University Press Encyclopedia of Psychology.

PsycCritiques – includes more than 36,000 book reviews, dating back to 1956. Produced by APA. In addition to reviews of current scholarly and professional books in psychology, the database also contains critiques of popular films and trade books from a psychological perspective.

PsycExtra (EBSCO) – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* APA PsycExtra. PsycExtra (Ebsco) produced by the American Psychological Association (APA), consists of technical, annual and government reports, conference papers, newsletters, magazines, newspapers, consumer brochures, etc.

PsychiatryOnline Premium – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* DSM-5, DSM Library. PsychiatryOnline Premium provides online access to a rich, well-rounded collection of psychiatry and psychology books from the APA, including the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fifth edition (DSM-5). This comprehensive collection covers diagnosis and differential diagnosis, case vignettes to bring abstract concepts to life, multidisciplinary treatment guidelines, as well as the latest research—all within a single search and navigation interface that integrates journals and books.

Psychoanalytic Electronic Publishing (PEP) Archive – full text of 13 psychoanalytic journals – some dating back to 1920 – and the full text of over 20 classic psychoanalytic books. There is a three year embargo on all journal content.

Psychology and Behavioral Sciences Collection – comprehensive database with nearly 480 full-text titles covering topics such as emotional and behavioral characteristics, psychiatry and psychology, mental processes, anthropology, and observational and experimental methods.

Psychotherapy.net – database of streaming videos covering the fundamentals of psychotherapy, counseling, and addiction treatment.

PsycINFO (EBSCO) – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* APA PsycINFO.

PsycINFO (Ebsco) is the comprehensive international database of psychology, which covers the academic, research, and practice literature in psychology from over 45 countries in more than 30 languages. The database mostly offers citations but there is some Full text available. (Results are roughly 20%- 50% full text depending on the subject.)

PsycTESTS (APA) – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* APA PsycTests.

A one-of-a-kind resource for measurement and instrumentation tools.

PsycTESTS® database is an extensive collection of items associated with psychological measures, scales, surveys, and other instruments essential to research in the behavioral and social sciences. PsycTESTS helps researchers easily find scales and measures for their own use.

SAGE Journals – provides searchable full-text to 1160+ journals with content relevant to all three FTS schools. For SOP there are 74 journals directly focused on psychiatry and neuroscience, along with 400+ auxiliary journals representing the health and medical fields.

Science Direct (Open Access Only) – ScienceDirect is Elsevier’s leading platform of peer-reviewed scholarly literature. It combines authoritative, full-text scientific, technical and health publications with smart, intuitive functionality. Students can utilize Elsevier's extensive open access journal program with 600+ fully open journals, and an additional 2000 journals with select open access content. Subjects covered include psychology, health science, and social sciences.

Tertiary / Reference / General Info Databases

Database = Most used

Article First – provides a machine created index to tables of contents pages from over 16,000 journals in business, science, humanities, social science, medicine, technology, and popular culture. Includes over 19 million citations from 1990 to the present.

Credo Reference – indexes full text articles from over 1000 encyclopedias and reference books from major publishers such as Cambridge, Harvard, Routledge, Britannica, including 50+ reference works on Christianity, and 180+ titles on psychology.

Dissertations & Theses Global (ProQuest) – provides access to more than 1.2 million full-text theses and dissertations available for download in PDF format, together with 2.7 million searchable citations to theses from around the world from 1861 to the present. Most are Ph.D. Dissertations from multiple disciplines, including psychology.

Encyclopedia of Religion Online (Gale Virtual Reference Library) – Gale References include their *Encyclopedia of Psychology, Child Development, and Gender: Sources, Perspectives, and Methodologies*, along with other references on religion and culture.

ERIC – covers journal articles and reports about education issued in Resources in Education (RIE) and Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE).

PsychiatryOnline Premium – *Alternative Name(s) & Keywords:* DSM-5, DSM Library.
